Digital Classrooms: The district is undergoing a digital transformation. During the 2013-2014 school year, Broward County Public Schools started the Digital 5 (D5) program, a 1:1 initiative that offered teachers and students the opportunity to engage in digital personalized learning in their classrooms. In its first year, the program served 3,200 fifth graders from 27 elementary schools and in 2014-2015 it expanded to serve third and fourth graders from 84 elementary schools.
