Type your paper on a computer and print it out on standard, white 8.5 x 11-inch paper. Double-space the text of your paper and use a legible font (e.g. Times New Roman). Whatever font you choose, MLA recommends that the regular and italics type styles contrast enough that they are each distinct from one another. The font size should be 12 pt.

Like all the other text in an MLA style paper, the title block is double-spaced. The title is in the same font as the rest of the paper — it is not boldface, or enlarged. There is no extra space above or below the title. A truly informative title will include the general topic, and your precise opinion on that topic.

Formatting the Header in MLA To create a header for your first page, follow these steps: Begin one inch from the top of the first page and flush with the left margin. Type your name, your instructor's name, the course number, and the date on separate lines, using double spaces between each.

If the excerpt spans multiple pages, use "pp." Note that MLA style uses a hyphen in a span of pages. If only one page of a print source is used, mark it with the abbreviation "p." before the page number (e.g., p.157). If a span of pages is used, mark it with the abbreviation "pp." before the page number (e.g., pp.157-68).

In MLA Style, referring to the works of others in your text is done using parenthetical citations. This method involves providing relevant source information in parentheses whenever a sentence uses a quotation or paraphrase.

Citing a Website in MLA: Place the author's name in reverse order, the last name first, followed by a comma, and then the first name followed by a period. The title of the web page or article is placed in quotation marks, with a period before the end quotation. The title of the website is written in italics followed by a comma.

Use the first writer's last name. Use the first writer listed on the source material. Do not use any of the other writers' names. Follow the first writer's name with a comma. Follow the comma with et al. Write et al. in lowercase letters. There is no punctuation after the et and there is always a period after the al.

Your MLA bibliography should begin on a separate page at the end of your essay. Include the same header (including your last name and the page number) in the top right corner on your bibliography page as the rest of your essay. Your essay should have a header on every page that includes your last name and the page number

Write the title about one third of the way down the page. The title should follow normal title capitalization standards: the first letter of each word should be capitalized with the exception of very short words such as articles or prepositions (e.g. the, and, of, or, a, an, in, to, for).
